


#### **RESIDENT POPULATION BY GENDER**

Death rate (deaths per 1,000 inhabitants)








#### **POPULATION AVERAGE AGE**

Age, 1981-2013




### **RESIDENT POPULATION BY AGE**

1st January 2013, % volume




#### **RESIDENT POPULATION BY GENDER**

Residence permits: refer to all foreigners holding a valid document issued by the Italian police authorities.

Ageing rate: ratio of population aged 65 and over to population aged 0-14.

**Dependency rate:** ratio of non-working age population (0-14; 65 and over) to working age population (15-64).




#### **INTERNAL FINAL CONSUMPTION BY TYPE**

**Available households income:** total incomes (salaries, earnings, pensions, rents, etc.) of each member of household aged 16 and over.

Available income per capita: available income of each member of household.

Household equity: household wealth based on the value of real assets (buildings, lands, companies, durable goods and jewelery) and financial assets (currency, deposits, shares, stocks).

Internal final consumption: goods and services bought or self-consumed by the household to satisfy their needs.

Large-scale retail trade: supermarkets, department stores, superstores, large non-food stores, minimarkets.





Average stay: ratio of number of days of stay to number of hospital stays.

Hospital bed occupancy rate: ratio between the real days of stay to potential days of stay (per 100). It represents the % share of real hospital beds used in relation to the available equipment.

Hospitalization rate: ratio of number of hospital stays to resident population (yearly average). It represents the average number of hospital stays per 1000 inhabitans.





**Editions:** total number of copies of a book printed at the same time and in the same form.

**Entertainment activities:** shows or other entertainment events, non-commercial performances, planned with the issuing of a ticket (free shows are not included in this category).





### Some definitions

**School system:** divided into six levels: pre-school education, primary, middle school, high schools, adult education (non-university), university.

University enrolments: students enroled at University in an Academic year, irrespective of the year of the course.

**Graduates:** students obtaining a qualification after the first three-year univeristy cycle (3 years), a two-year university cycle (3+2 years), a "unique" formula university course (5 or 6 years).






#### LABOUR FORCE BY GENDER

**Employees:** all individuals aged 15 and over in the reference week who have carried out at least 1 hour of paid work or are absent from work for holidays or illness.

Activity rate: ratio of people in the labour force to the corresponding reference population.

Unemployment rate: ratio of job-seekers to labour force.

**Job-seekers:** all unemployed individuals aged 15-64 who have carried out at least 1 active action of job search during the 30 days preceding the survey or they will begin work in 3 months and are available to work in the 2 weeks following the interview.

Employment rate: ratio of employees to the corresponding reference population.








#### **VALUE ADDED AT BASIC PRICES BY BRANCH**



Consumer price index: measures the changes in the price of a basket of goods and services through time. Istat adopts three consumer price indexes:


- Consumer price index for the whole nation (NIC): covers the consumption of the country's entire present population;
- Consumer price index for blue and white collar workers households (CPI): covers the consumption of households having an employee as a reference person;
- Harmonised EU consumer price index (HICP): refers to the general community of households present but the survey is
  restricted to the consumption of goods and services in the various EU countries with comparable prices.





### Some definitions

**Companies:** enterprises that organise an economic activity professionally to produce or exchange goods and services. The locations of active production are subdivided into company offices (head office, legal office) and local units (secondary sites such as factories, laboratories, shops, etc.).

**Handicraft companies:** company registered in the Albo Provinciale Artigiani (The Provincial List of craft companies) provided for in article 5 of law no. 443 of 8 August 1985.

Female companies: company that have over 50% of female members.

Young companies: company that have over 50% of young members (under 35 years old).

Foreign companies: company that have over 50% of foreign members.




#### **ENTERPRENEURS BY GENDER**
















#### **TOURIST NIGHTS BY ORIGIN**




#### **TOURIST FLOWS** (2004-2013)










#### **PORT OF CHIOGGIA: goods handled**



#### Some definitions

#### Some definitions

Loans: funds lent to economic sectors in the province.

Deposits: current accounts, deposits, conditioned liabilities deferring obligations, prompt action to meet due dates of liabilities.

Bad debts: the total loans outstanding to borrowers who have been declared insolvent or who are in a basically comparable situation. Bank counter: bank office where deposits and current accounts operations can be made.

ATM (Automated Teller Machine): automatic machine that effect bank counter operations with concurrent updating of the balance of the client's account, and other banking operations.

POS (Points of Sale): automatic machine at companies connected to the bank from which automatic debits of the company's bank account can be made to pay for goods or services, and the vendor's or service provider's account credited.

Bankruptcy: judicial procedure by which the equity of an insolvent entrepreneur is liquidated in proportion to settling the debts to

Protest: formal deed to object to the refusal of the drawee to accept the bill of exchange or failure to pay the bill of exchange or to honour a bank cheque.

Crimes: action for which the main penalty is imprisonment and/or a fine or a series of additional penalties.

**Prison conviction:** person given a prison sentence for committing an imprisonable offence.
