








RESIDENT POPULATION BY GENDER















Harmonised EU consumer price index (HICP): refers to the general community of households present but the survey is restricted to the consumption of goods and services in the various EU countries with comparable prices.











TOURIST NIGHTS BY ORIGIN


TOURIST FLOWS (2002-2011)







GOODS HANDLED (millions of tonnes)




PASSENGER TRAFFIC (millions of passengers)


AIRPORTS OF VENICE AND TREVISO (2007-2011)

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Since few years, the Venice Chamber of Commerce publishes "*Venice in figures*", a short and user friendly report describing with simple numbers and statistics the main economic, demographic, social and territorial aspects of the province of Venice.

The booklet is organized into fourteen topics obtained from several statistical and administrative sources e.g. National Statistical Institute and the network of the Italian Chambers of Commerce; in-depth sections and glossaries allow an easy access even to a non-expert public.

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
