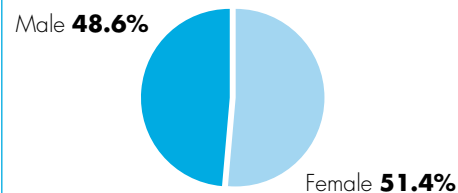

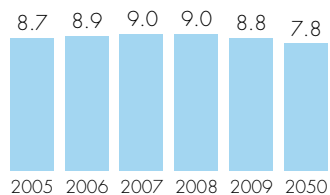

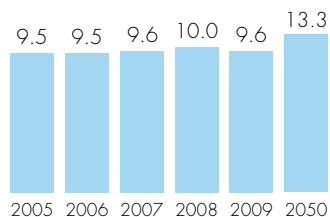

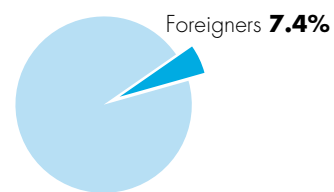

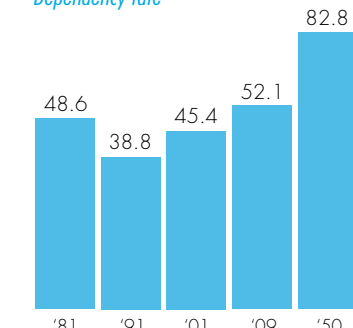

Birth rate: ratio between the number of live births and the average resident population (per 1,000 inhabitants).

Death rate: ratio between the number of deaths and the average resident population (per 1,000 inhabitants).

Ageing rate: ratio of population aged 65 and over to population aged 0-14.

Dependency rate: ratio of non-working age population (0-14; 65 and over) to working age population (15-64).

Residence permits: refer to all foreigners holding a valid document issued by the Italian police authorities.

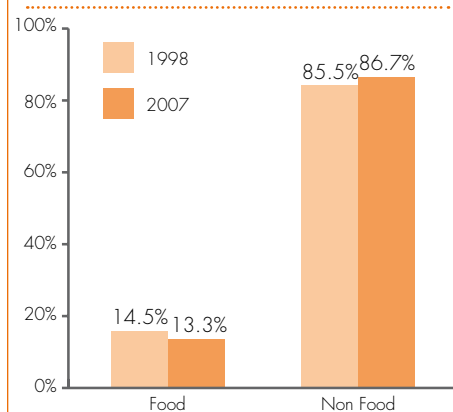

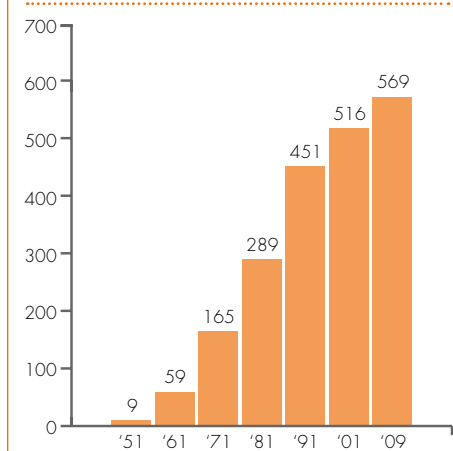

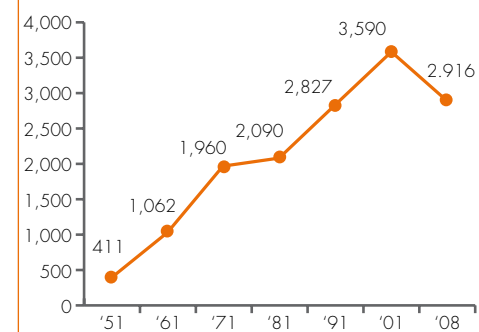

Available households income: total incomes (salaries, earnings, pensions, rents, etc.) of each member of household aged 16 and over.

Available income per capita: available income of each member of household.

Household equity: household wealth based on the value of real assets (buildings, lands, enterprises, durable goods and jewelery) and financial assets (currency, deposits, shares, stocks).

Internal final consumption: goods and services bought or self-consumed by the household to satisfy their needs.

Large-scale retail trade: supermarkets, department stores, superstores, large non-food stores, minimarkets.

Local Health Service: public hospitals and accredited private clinics.

Hospitalization rate: ratio of number of hospital stays to resident population (yearly average). It represents the average number of hospital stays per 1000 inhabitants.

Hospital bed occupancy rate: ratio between the real days of stay to potential days of stay (per 100). It represents the % share of real hospital beds used in relation to the available equipment.

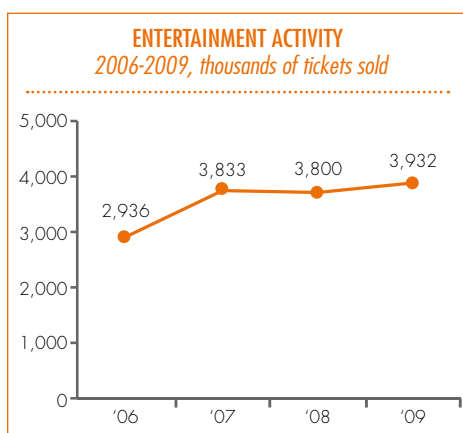
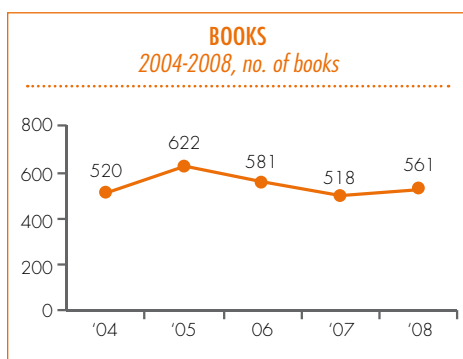

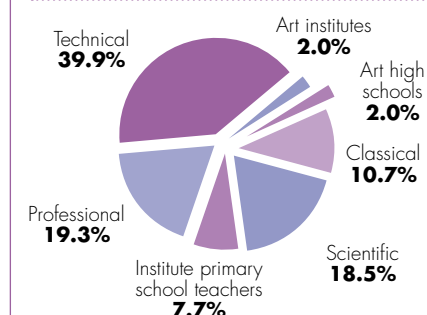

SOME DEFINITIONS

Publisher: a person or a company responsible for the publication of a book or document. Publishers also include Research Offices and companies with a publishing activity as secondary business.

Books: non-periodical work in no less than five pages, in one or more volumes, booklets or issues published as a whole or in parts during the same year.

Editions: total number of copies of a book printed at the same time and in the same form.

Entertainment activities: shows or other entertainment events, non-commercial performances, planned with the issuing of a ticket (free shows are not included in this category).

SOME DEFINITIONS

School system: divided into six levels: pre-school education, primary, middle school, high schools, adult education (non-university), university.

University enrolments: students enrolled at University in an Academic year, irrespective of the year of the course.

Special education needs teacher: teacher specifically employed to work with children physically disabled, sensory impaired (i.e. deaf/blind), have speech and language difficulties, have a mental disability or behavioural difficulties.

Graduates: students obtaining a qualification after the first three-year university cycle (3 years), a two-year university cycle (3+2 years), a "unique" formula university course (5 or 6 years).

Consumer price index: measures the changes in the price of a basket of goods and services through time.

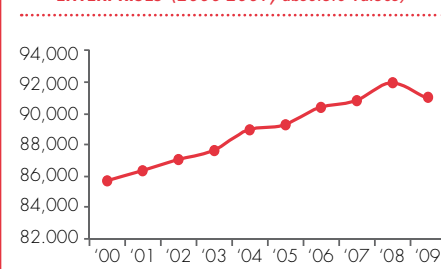
Istat adopts **three consumer price indexes:**

- **Consumer price index for the whole nation (NIC):** covers the consumption of the country's entire present population;
- **Consumer price index for blue and white collar workers households (CPI):** covers the consumption of households having an employee as a reference person;
- **Harmonised EU consumer price index (HICP):** refers to the general community of households present but the survey is restricted to the consumption of goods and services in the various EU countries with comparable prices.

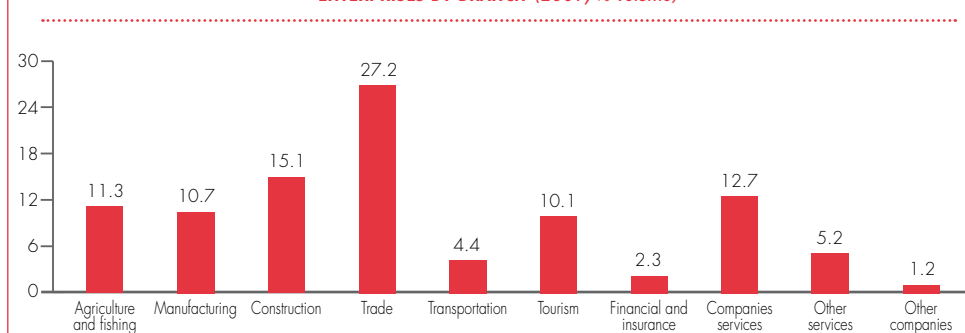
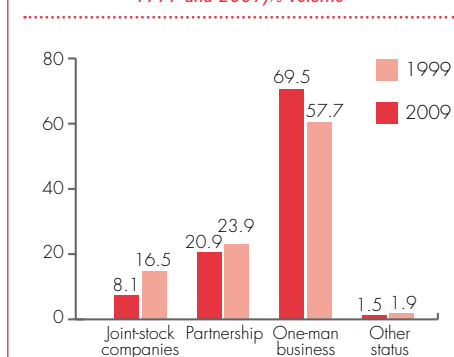

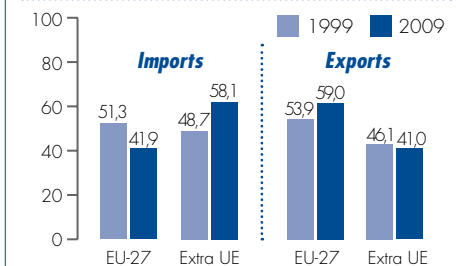

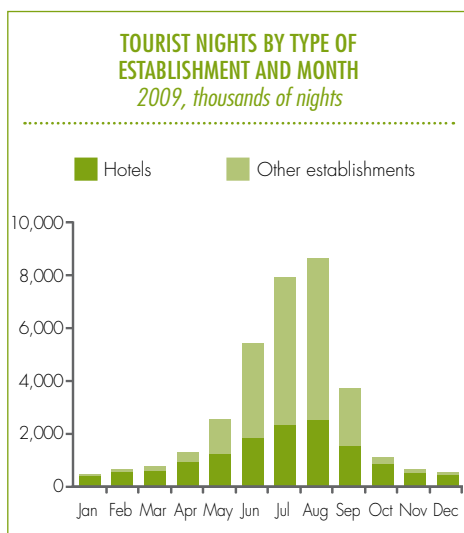

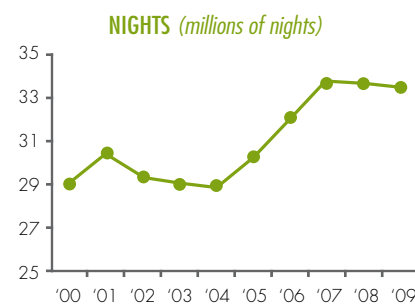
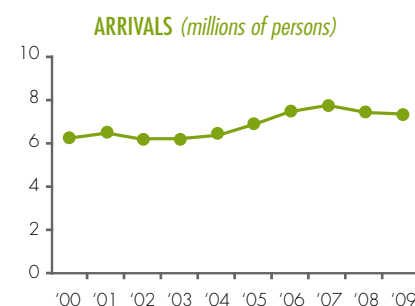

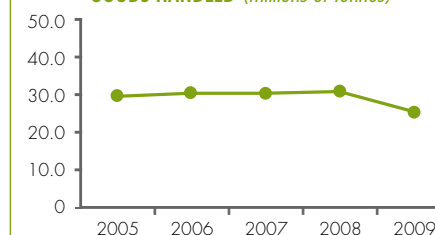

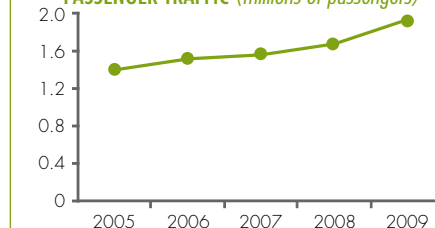

PORT OF VENICE (2005-2009)

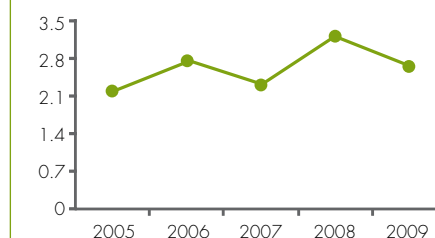
GOODS HANDLED (millions of tonnes)



PASSENGER TRAFFIC (millions of passengers)

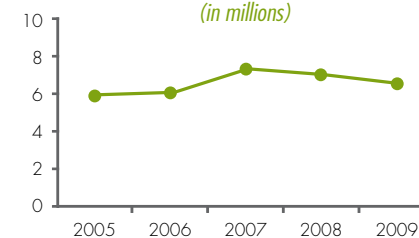


PORT OF CHIOGGIA: goods handled 2005-2009, millions of tonnes

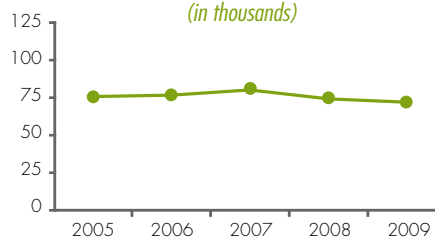


VENICE AIRPORT (2005-2009)
